International exposure at MMU

MMU has constantly strived to expose its students and staff as well as the surrounding communities to wider sources of knowledge. Experts from Europe, Asia and Northern America, as well as from Uganda itself have visited MMU to share experiences, knowledge and skills. Topics have included development, microfinance, history and research methods.

Furthermore, MMU has been fortunate to partner with organizations that have provided staff on secondment, sometimes for several years. Volunteers Missionaries Movement (VMM) from Ireland has seconded the first two Vice-Chancellors, Professor Davey and Dr Nisbet, as well as eight other staff members to support the finance department, library and the planning and development unit respectively. Another VMM-volunteer supported teaching of accounting in the School of Business and Management Studies, and was instrumental in our graduates winning waivers from the Ugandan Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Similarly, the Volunteer Service Organization (VSO, Great Britain) seconded another staff member to the Planning and Development Unit.

German International Cooperation (GIZ) has seconded four members of staff, including the current dean of SBMS. These international colleagues have contributed to building robust systems at MMU as well as offering invaluable international exposure to their Ugandan colleagues.

KRC is an indigenous not-profit making organization. It currently operates in the 7 Districts of the Rwenzori Sub Region, 4 Districts in Bunyoro and Mubende in Buganda Region. The core business of the 19 year old organization includes inter alia, capacity building of small holder farmers in agronomy, food security and post harvest handling, agri-business, promoting peace building and harmonious co-existence, promoting climate change mitigation mechanisms, research, governance and policy advocacy.

These initiatives are informed by the proactive research studies the institution undertakes in the quest to coalesce development efforts in Uganda. KRC has since added a the farmers radio station-KRC 102 FM that broadcasts information on weather, markets, prices of agricultural commodities, genuine farm inputs. In future, KRC aspires to create Uganda's first farmers' Television!
